

Resurrection People!

What is your **favorite time** of the year? Is it your **birthday**, the **last day of school**, the **first day of school**, **summer vacation?** How about **Christmas time**? A Christmas carol claims, "**It's the most wonderful time of the year!**" The reality is that **Easter** is the most wonderful time of the year. It is all of your favorite days **rolled into one**. It is the **Feast of Feast for the King of Kings!** We celebrate the Easter **season** for a total of 50 days. As we prepared with 40 days of penance during Lent we now celebrate for 50 days.

As we continue to celebrate Easter, today we stop and ask ourselves "am I a Resurrection person"? Has the Easter Resurrection of Christ made a difference in my life?

The Resurrection changed the life of Jesus' disciples forever. They have an **encounter with the Risen Lord**. After they have seen the Resurrected Lord they are new people. We must ask ourselves the same question. **Have I seen the Risen Lord**? Has Easter touched me? Has my life been changed by God? Is the power of the Resurrection part of my daily experience? As humans our two greatest enemies are **sin and death**. The message of Easter is that Jesus has come and conquered them. **SIN**

The essence of the Easter message is that Jesus died for our sins. We have an advocate in Jesus. The ancient sense of **advocate** was a legal counselor or lawyer. St. John is saying when we confess our sins we have Jesus as our lawyer! He will plead for our innocence because he has died for our sins. To be full of **Easter joy** we need to live in the freedom we have through the forgiveness of sins. There is nothing more freeing, nothing more liberating than making a **good confession** and knowing that our sins are forgiven. We always hear of Easter joy. This joy comes from the forgiveness of sins.

There is no sin that cannot be forgiven. To say that there is a sin that cannot be forgiven is to say that there is a sin that is stronger than the Cross of Jesus. There is no sin that is stronger than the love of Christ. The only sin that cannot be forgiven is the sin that is not brought to the Cross. **Easter proclaims victory over sin!**

Have I **sinned grievously**? I can bring my sins to the Cross of Jesus Christ and he will forgive them. Had **Judas** asked for forgiveness Jesus would have granted it. **Peter** abandoned Jesus but he was taken back and forgiven. **John left his clothes in the garden and ran away leaving our Lord. Have you betrayed Jesus** in some way? Go to him and ask forgiveness. Avail yourself of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and experience the **freedom that Peter found.**

DEATH

Our other great fear is death. We may wonder, when I die is that it? Death is the last frontier. We stop and think what is life all about? Is all that awaits me death? The Resurrection answers that fear. We rejoice today because the Resurrection points to eternal life. Jesus rising from the tomb points to the fact that we too can live forever with Him. For many people the greatest fear is of death. Jesus smashed the jaws of death by rising from the grave. No longer does death have power over us. Death is a passageway into eternal life.

While he walked this earth he promised his followers **eternal life**. Today that promise comes true as Jesus rises from the tomb. He was put to death but on the third day he rose. This means his promises are true. Some day you and I will be laid into a tomb. That is not the end of the story.

You see it is the **most wonderful time of the year**. Are you burdened by **sin**? Bring it to Calvary and be set free. Are you **grieving** over the loss of a loved one? Do you **fear death**? Death calls for a time of sadness but always built on **hope**.

Let these next seven weeks be a time of renewal for us. Will there be challenging days ahead? Undoubtedly. Will we face hardships and struggles ahead? Surely. But Easter reminds us we never walk alone. How has the risen Lord impacted your life? Are you an Easter person year-round? When we realize how much we have been given how can we fail to be joyful, generous people? You receive the forgiveness of your sins and eternal life! Easter is the most wonderful time of the year. Christ's resurrection is our resurrection. Let us embrace the freedom He won for us.
