The Good Shepherd

We see many shepherds in the Bible: Abel, Father Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, David and the shepherds at Bethlehem. We have all seen a painting or statue of the Good Shepherd. From the Old Testament through the New Testament God's people are compared to a flock of sheep and God is compared to a shepherd. One of the favorite scriptures of all time is Psalm 23, "The Lord is my Shepherd, there is nothing I shall want." This is made manifest in Jesus who comes as the Good Shepherd who will lay down his life for his sheep. In the Gospel Jesus says, "My sheep hear my voice. I know them and they follow me." This image is such a common metaphor for us that we may never give it a second thought. Since this image is used so frequently by the prophets and Jesus we should take some time to apply this comparison to our lives.

Unless we've grown up on a farm, we may not be familiar with the **life of sheep**. **Sheep require much care**. The shepherd knows where the rich fields are and tries to lead the sheep to the best fields. A shepherd must lead them to their summer fields and to their winter fields so that they will be **properly nourished**. A shepherd must labor to **keep his flock together**. The sheep can be independent minded and thinking they know more than the shepherd and may try to go off on their own. If a sheep becomes separated from the flock it risks **starvation**, **being trapped on a mountain or attack from wild animals**. Sheep quickly become accustomed to the **voice of the shepherd** and know when to follow because the shepherd will lead them to **safety**. A good shepherd will **leave the 99** in search of the lost sheep. In fact the good shepherd will lay down his life for his sheep.

There are many parallels to **our** life of discipleship. The **Shepherd** of our flock is Jesus. The **voice** of Jesus leads us and protects us. Because Jesus would not be present here on earth after the Ascension he gave us the Apostles and their successors, today's **bishops** as shepherds. What does a bishop carry in procession but a **crozier**, or shepherd's staff in order to remind us of his role as shepherd? In a very special way Christ gave us Peter and the Successor of Peter, **the Pope**, to be our visible head on earth. The Pope is our **chief shepherd on earth** because he represents Christ on earth. He is the vicar, or deputy of Christ.

One way to accustom ourselves to the voice of the Shepherd is through daily prayer. Jesus says "My sheep hear my voice. I know them and they follow me." Can I say that I hear the voice of Jesus? I find in prayer that we are very good at asking God for assistance. When we have a health crisis, a financial need or a relationship issue we turn to God. But how good are we are stopping to listen to the voice of God? Do I know the voice of the Shepherd? How often do I consult God about my marriage, my job, my children, or my health? The Good Shepherd wants to speak to us on a daily basis. Am I listening?

It is important for sheep to stay nourished. The shepherd tries to lead them to the best of fields. Prayer and study ensure that we can remain **nourished**. We can stay attuned to the voice of the shepherd by reading the **words of life of Jesus in the Bible**. We can read also **spiritual books and journals**. These are the rich fields of plenty that the shepherd leads us to. Is our relationship with Christ the most important thing in our life? Does what we read and talk about reflect this? Do we devote time and energy to growing in this relationship with the Shepherd?

There is one **glaring difference** in the whole analogy of the sheep and the shepherd, however. Most shepherds eventually **eat their sheep**. Our Shepherd gives up His very Body to **feed us**. **Our Shepherd has laid down his life for his sheep**. **This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Happy are those who are called to his supper!** Truly we serve the **Good Shepherd**!
